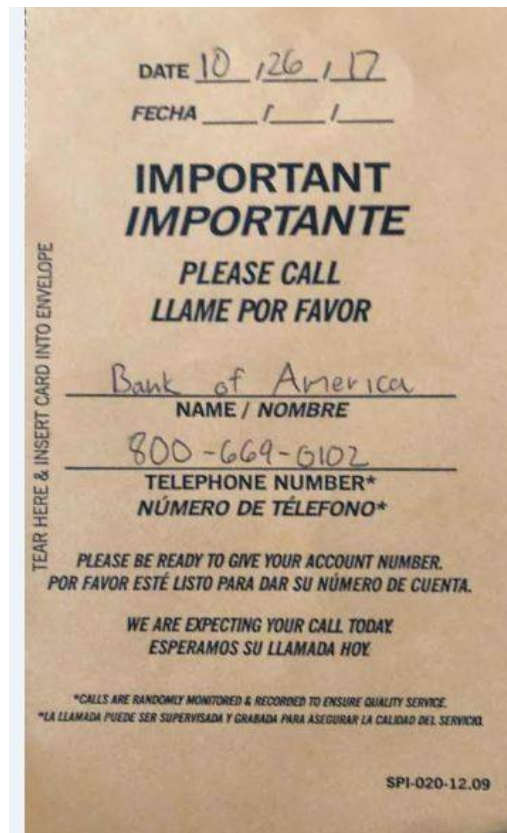


# Attention All Residents!

Over the weekend, a Neighborhood Watch Captain inquiring about a notice that one of her neighbors received. **Please take a look at the picture provided\* and know that this is a scam.** **If you ever receive any sort of document asking you to call them immediately, please call the number on the back of your credit card that was issued by your bank or credit institution and verify that your account is in good standing.** **Never use the number provided** on one of these slips, an email or text message that uses phrases like “security update”. Please do not call the number that was provided to you that may have been sent in the mail.

ALSO, I often get an email that appears to be from one of my credit cards telling me that I need to update my information due to a “security update” and provides a “link” to log in. **After examining the email I have found that there is only a slight difference in the email address such as a dot instead of a dash but that little difference can be huge.** So when and if you happen to get these e-mails **go directly to the credit card’s website and log in or call** to see if there is any sort of breach or security concern with your debit or credit card. **No one should click on any links provided in email.**
